Sickness in the nursery

Reading at home with your child

This term we are focusing more on reading to get the children to improve their concentration, vocabulary and to get the children to develop an interest in looking at books.



Tips to help children enjoy reading



- Read about something your child is interested in Ask your child questions about the book and get them to use the pictures to tell the story to you or predict what is going to happen.
- Read books and poems with rhymes and repetitions and repeated phrases to get your child to join in.
- Join your child to your local library and encourage them to choose a book independently.
